



The American Jewish Experience

Join a team of noted experts for an exciting and unusual exploration of Jewish life and culture in America. Taught and designed collaboratively by four leading scholars, this multidisciplinary course ranges over history, politics, the family, feminism, popular music, comedy, film, fiction, and autobiography in order to ask fundamental questions about the changing experience of Jews in America. How has American Jewish identity been fashioned in different times and places in American history? What different conceptions of Jewishness have American Jews put forth? How have American Jews looked at basic ideas such as "roots", "authenticity", "ethnicity", "community", and so on? How has the structure and nature of the Jewish family changed in America, and how has this affected gender roles? Why have certain political stances tended to maintain their appeal for American Jews over time? How have American Jews viewed other ethnic and/or religious groups in America? The expertise and enthusiasm of the instructors, the inviting material, and the provocative questions promise to draw students into a lively, enriching, and personally compelling conversation.
